What is the Albuquerque Goals Summit?

Since 1995, residents of Albuquerque have met to define the community conditions they view as most important to ensuring the city is an active, thriving, culturally rich, and sustainable high desert community. The *Goals Summit* is the main source of resident input into the city's goal-setting process. Participants at the forum play a vital role by describing the future Albuquerque they would like to see. This year, the forum will focus on three of the city's eight goals:

- Public Safety, currently defined as “The public is safe, secure and shares responsibility for maintaining a safe environment.”
- Economic Vitality, currently defined as “The community supports a vital, diverse and sustainable economy.”
- Environmental Protection, currently defined as “Protect Albuquerque’s natural environments – its mountains, river, bosque, volcanos, arroyos, air and water.”

The Albuquerque Indicators Progress Commission (IPC) is the convener of these forums. Your input can outline a meaningful path for elected officials and community leaders to follow.

The four community summit location options are:

Saturday, July 21 (9:00 am to 12:00 pm) at Saint Pius X High School;

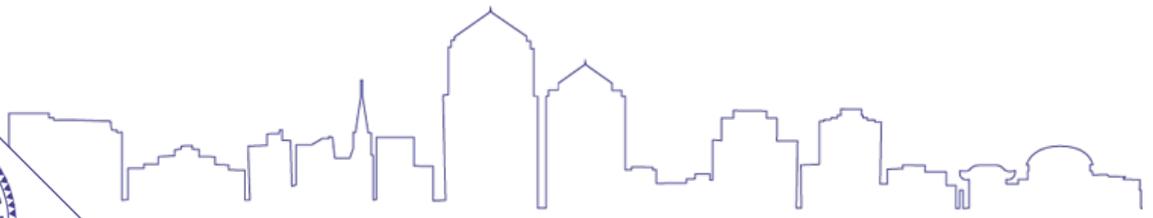

Thursday, July 26 (3:00 to 6:00 pm) at Sid Cutter Pilot's Pavilion @ Balloon Fiesta Park;

Friday, July 27 (3:00 to 6:00 pm) at the African American Performing Arts Center; and

Saturday, July 28 (9:00 am to 12:00 pm) at the National Hispanic Cultural Center (Includes both English and Spanish-speaking only discussion groups)

What changes were made in 2016 to the city's goals?

In 2016, residents of Albuquerque provided input on the goals and desired community conditions for:



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- Goal 1: Human & Family Development – People of all ages have the opportunity to participate in the community and economy and are well sheltered, safe, healthy, and educated. Based on this input, the Albuquerque City Council made the following changes.
- Goal 7: Community & Cultural Engagement – Residents are engaged in Albuquerque's community and culture.

Based on public input, the Albuquerque City Council made adjustments to the desired community conditions for Goal 1 to address the needs for career skills, behavioral health services, and public health information. New language is italicized:

- “Residents are literate, *skilled*, and educated.”
- “Ready for work, life or school” was replaced with, “Ready for *a career or post-secondary education*.”
- “Residents have access to health care services” was expanded to, “Residents have access to *medical and behavioral health care services*.”
- “Residents are *informed of and* protected from public health risks.”
- “Affordable housing *options* are available *throughout the city*.”
- New items: “*Seniors live with dignity in supportive environments*” and “*Seniors engage in and contribute to the community*.”

Regarding Goal 7: Community & Cultural Engagement, the Albuquerque City Council made the following changes:

- “Residents participate in civic activities and community improvement” was changed to “*Residents engage in civic, community, and charitable activities*.”
- “Residents participate in Albuquerque’s arts and cultures” was changed to “*Residents engage in Albuquerque’s arts and cultures*.”
- “Relations among Albuquerque’s cultures and races are positive and respectful” was changed to, “*Albuquerque celebrates and respects the diversity of its people*.”

One new DCC was also added to the Economic Vitality goal, based on public input, “Albuquerque is a place where youth feel engaged and believe they can build a future”.
