AGRICULTURE

- [Farmers Market Promotion Program](#)

Purpose: A grant program to develop, coordinate, and expand direct producer to consumer markets to help increase access to regionally-produced agricultural products. FMPP offers both Capacity Building (CB) and Community Development, Training, and Technical Assistance (CTA) projects.

Eligible Applicants: Local and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits and private businesses.

Funding Information: \$13,500,000 in total funds, 60 awards expected.

Deadline: May 11th, 2020

Purpose: The goal of the LFPP grant is to develop, coordinate, and expand local and regional food business enterprises that engage as intermediaries in indirect producer-to-consumer marketing to help increase access to locally- and regionally-produced agricultural products. LFPP offers both Planning and Implementation projects.

Eligible Applicants: Local and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits and private businesses.

Funding Information: \$13,500,000 in total funds, 60 awards expected.

Deadline: May 11th, 2020

- [The National Farmworker Jobs Program \(NFJP\) Career Services and Training Grants and Housing Grants](#)

Purpose: Assists eligible Migrant and Seasonal Farmworkers and their dependents to receive career services, training services, housing assistance services, youth services, and other related assistance services, including emergency services, that help stabilize their current agriculture jobs as well as acquire new skills they need to start careers that provide higher wages and year-round employment.

Eligible Applicants: Entities that can demonstrate an understanding of labor issues among migrant and seasonal farmworkers, a familiarity with local agricultural conditions, and a capacity to administer program activities for this service population.

Funding Information: \$91,896,000 in total funds, 65 awards expected.

Purpose: Supports the development and implementation of projects that focus on improving the quality and efficiency of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) operations and processes.

Funding Information: Awards of up to \$2,000,000 offered.

Purpose: Assists agricultural producers and rural small businesses in installing renewable energy systems and energy efficiency improvements in order to reduce energy consumption.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

- [OVC FY 2020 Enhancing Community Responses to America's Addiction Crisis: Serving Our Youngest Crime Victims](#)

Purpose: This program will provide funding to support direct services to children and youth who are crime victims as a result of the nation's addiction crisis (Purpose Area 1) and training and technical assistance for grantees (Purpose Area 2).

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits, for-profit businesses, and institutions of higher education.

Funding Information: \$19,000,000 in total funds, 26 awards expected.

Deadline: May 4th, 2020

- [BJA FY 20 Innovations in Reentry Initiative: Building System Capacity & Testing Strategies to Reduce Recidivism](#)

Purpose: Provides jurisdictions with the resources to identify assets and gaps in their reentry systems and to improve their overall approach to reentry.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments.

Funding Information: \$8,000,000 in total funds, 4 awards expected.

Deadline: May 4th, 2020

- [OJJDP FY 20 Juvenile Justice and Mental Health Collaboration Program](#)

Purpose: Supports cross-system collaboration to improve responses and outcomes for youth with mental illness, or co-occurring mental illness and substance abuse, who come into contact with the juvenile justice system.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments.

Funding Information: \$5,000,000 in total funds, 6 awards expected.

Deadline: May 4th, 2020

- [BJA FY 20 Second Chance Act Community-Based Reentry Program](#)

Purpose: Supports efforts to implement or expand on reentry programs that demonstrate strong partnerships with corrections, parole, probation, and other reentry service providers. These partnerships should develop comprehensive case management plans that directly address criminogenic risk and needs.

Eligible Applicants: Tribal governments and nonprofit organizations.

Funding Information: \$8,000,000 in total funds, 4 awards expected.

Deadline: May 4th, 2020

- [BJA FY 20 Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program to Support Law Enforcement Agencies](#)

Purpose: Funds the purchase of body-worn cameras (BWC) that are implemented as part of comprehensive BWC programs.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments.

Funding Information: \$10,500,000 in total funds, 45 awards expected.

Deadline: May 5th, 2020

- [BJA FY 20 Harold Rogers Prescription Drug Monitoring Program \(PDMP\)](#)

Purpose: Provides funding to plan, implement, or enhance prescription drug monitoring programs to accommodate local decision-making based on state laws and preferences, while encouraging the replication of promising practices.

Eligible Applicants: State and local governments.

Funding Information: \$28,000,000 in total funds, 14 awards expected.

Deadline: May 5th, 2020

- [OVC FY 2020 Enhancing Services for Older Victims of Abuse and Financial Exploitation](#)

Purpose: This program supports the implementation of projects intended to improve outcomes, minimize additional trauma, and restore safety and security to older adult victims of abuse and financial exploitation.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits, for-profit businesses, and institutions of higher education.

Funding Information: \$6,000,000 in total funds, 12 awards expected.

Deadline: May 5th, 2020

- [OVC FY 2020 Expanding SANE Services to Victims of Sexual Assault on Campus](#)

Purpose: Funds efforts to establish and/or expand Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) programs that will offer medical forensic care, advocacy, and other victim services to sexual assault survivors on college campuses.

Eligible Applicants: Institutions of higher education.

Funding Information: \$8,000,000 in total funds, 16 awards expected.

- [BJA FY 20 Adult Drug Court and Veterans Treatment Court Discretionary Grant Program](#)

Purpose: Provides financial and technical assistance to governments to enhance the operations of adult drug courts or to implement new veterans' treatment courts in order to provide treatment alternatives to those with substance use disorders involved in the criminal justice system.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments.

Funding Information: \$750,000,000 in total funds, 96 awards expected.

Purpose: Supports cross-system collaborations to improve responses and outcomes for individuals with mental illnesses or co-occurring mental illness and substance abuse who come into contact with the justice system. This program supports violence reduction through social service and via partnerships that will improve law enforcement responses to people with such conditions.

Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments.

Funding Information: \$19,000,000 in total funds, 25 awards expected.

Purpose: Supports the development and ongoing operations of task forces to address human trafficking via a multidisciplinary approach utilizing both law enforcement and victims' service resources.

Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits. Applicants must submit two applications demonstrating collaboration between a law enforcement entity and a victim service agency or nonprofit.

Funding Information: \$22,000,000 in total funds, 28 awards expected.

Purpose: The purpose of this program is to develop, expand, or strengthen victim service programs for victims of human trafficking.

Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits.

Funding Information: \$16,500,000 in total funds, 30 awards expected.

Deadline: May 18th, 2020

- [OVC FY 2020 Services for Minor Victims of Labor Trafficking](#)

Purpose: The purpose of this program is to develop, expand, or strengthen victim service programs for minor victims of labor trafficking, whose victimization occurred when they were under the age of 18.

Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits.

Funding Information: \$2,000,000 in total funds, 3 awards expected.

Deadline: May 18th, 2020

- [OVC FY 2020 Improving Outcomes for Child and Youth Victims of Human Trafficking](#)

Purpose: The overall goal of the program is to improve responses for child and youth victims of trafficking with a focus on coordination at the statewide or tribal jurisdiction level to create effective change across systems.

Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits.

Funding Information: \$6,000,000 in total funds, 4 awards expected.

Deadline: May 18th, 2020

- [BJA FY 20 Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Abuse Site-based Program \(COSSAP\)](#)

Purpose: Provides financial and technical assistance to governments in order to identify, treat, and support those impacted by illicit opioids, stimulants, and other drugs of abuse.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments.

Funding Information: \$156,000,000 in total funds, 120 awards expected.

Deadline: May 21st, 2020

- [OJJDP FY 20 Comprehensive Anti-Gang Programs for Youth](#)

Purpose: This solicitation provides funding for communities to develop youth gang intervention or suppression programs that aim to reduce violence.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as nonprofits and institutions of higher education.

Funding Information: \$6,530,000 in total funds, 19 awards expected.

Deadline: May 26th, 2020

- [FY 2020 Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program](#)

Purpose: Provides funding to assist governments in preparing for and responding to the COVID-19 pandemic. Allowable projects and purchases include, but are not limited to, overtime, equipment (including law enforcement and medical personal protective equipment), hiring, supplies (such as gloves, masks, sanitizer), training, travel expenses, and addressing the medical needs of inmates in prisons, jails, and detention centers.

Purpose: Provides funding to support shelter and transitional housing services to victims of domestic violence and their companion animals.

- [OJJDP FY 20 Reducing Risk for Girls in the Juvenile Justice System](#)

Purpose: This program supports prevention and early intervention strategies for girls who are involved in the juvenile justice system.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as nonprofits and institutions of higher education.

Funding Information: \$1,700,000 in total funds, 4 awards expected.

Deadline: June 1st, 2020

- [Family Violence Prevention and Services Discretionary Grants: Specialized Services for Abused Parents and Their Children \(Demonstration Projects\)](#)

Purpose: Supports demonstration projects that will focus on expanding capacity to prevent future domestic violence by addressing the needs of children exposed to family violence, domestic violence, or dating violence. Grantees are required to offer trauma-informed, developmentally appropriate, and culturally relevant/linguistically accessible service to victims.

Eligible Applicants: Local and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits.

Funding Information: \$8,250,000 in total funds, 26 awards expected.

Deadline: June 5th, 2020

- [BJA FY 20 Postconviction Testing of DNA Evidence](#)

Purpose: The goal of this program is to assist states and units of local government with postconviction DNA testing in cases of violent felony offenses where actual innocence might be demonstrated.

Eligible Applicants: State and local governments, as well as institutions of higher education.

Funding Information: \$5,400,000 in total funds, 12 awards expected.

Deadline: June 15th, 2020

- [BJA FY 20 Sexual Assault Forensic Evidence - Inventory, Tracking, and Reporting Program](#)

Purpose: Supports governmental efforts to inventory, track, and report the status of Sexual Assault Kits. Applicants are expected to identify and prioritize (for testing) SAKs for which prosecution of a perpetrator is soon to be barred by the expiration of an applicable statute of limitations.

Purpose: Supports the prosecution of violent crime cold cases, where DNA from a suspect has been identified. Provided that DNA attributed to a known or unknown suspect has been identified, funding support includes investigative activities and forensic analyses that could lead to such cases.

Eligible Applicants: State and local governments.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Purpose: A grant program offered by the Minority Business Development Agency with a focus on supporting female entrepreneurs of color to build their businesses, secure contracts and capital, and increase employment opportunities.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits, for-profit businesses, and institutions of higher education.

Funding Information: \$3,000,000 in total funds, 3 awards expected.

Deadline: May 30th, 2020

- [Rural Community Development Initiative](#)

Purpose: Offers funding to intermediaries who can provide financial and technical assistance to recipients to develop their capacity to undertake projects related to housing, community facilities, or economic development that will support the community.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits, for-profit businesses, and institutions of higher education.

Funding Information: \$6,000,000 in total funds, 25 awards expected.

ENVIRONMENT/PUBLIC LANDS

- [FY 2020 and FY 2021 Source Reduction Assistance Grant Program](#)

Purpose: Supports research, investigation, study, demonstration, education and training using source reduction approaches to prevent pollution from entering waste streams.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits and institutions of higher education.

Such approaches include convening multi-sectoral partnerships, identifying risk and protective factors for suicidal ideation, expanding current prevention practices, and producing actionable data relevant to future public health interventions.

Eligible Applicants: Unrestricted.

Funding Information: \$35,000,000 in total funds, 10 awards expected.

Purpose: Funds projects to implement sexual risk avoidance education targeted to participants that reside in areas with high rates of teen births and/or those who are at greatest risk of contracting sexually transmitted infections.

Purpose: The purpose of the DFC Program is to establish and strengthen collaborations to support the efforts of community coalitions working to prevent substance use among youth by addressing the factors in a community that increase the risk of substance abuse.

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofits – state, local, and tribal governments may serve as bona fide agents.

Purpose: This funding opportunity is aimed towards promoting rural Tele-emergency services with an emphasis on tele-stroke, tele-behavioral health, and Tele-Emergency Medical Services (Tele-EMS). Applicants can achieve these goals by enhancing telehealth networks to deliver 24-hour Emergency Department consultation services via telehealth to rural healthcare providers.

Purpose: Provides grant funding to assist low-income homeowners in repairing and rehabilitating their homes in rural areas. Program funds may also be used to assist rental property owners and cooperative housing complexes in repairing and rehabilitating their units if they agree to make such units available to low-income persons.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal governments, as well as relevant nonprofits, for-profit businesses, and institutions of higher education.

Funding Information: \$15,340,827 in total funds, 160 awards expected.

- [Fair Housing Initiative Program - Education and Outreach Initiative \(EOI\)](#)

Purpose: Provides funding to develop education and outreach programs designed to inform members of the public concerning their rights and obligations under the provisions of the Fair Housing Act.

Eligible Applicants: Qualified Fair Housing Enforcement Organizations (QFHOs), Fair Housing Enforcement Organizations (FHOs), and nonprofit groups organizing to build their capacity to

provide fair housing enforcement.

Purpose: Funds may be used to decrease the cost of energy for rural communities and small businesses by installing energy efficiency measures.

Eligible Applicants: Current and former Rural Utility Service (RUS) borrowers, subsidiaries of current or former RUS borrowers, and entities that provide retail electric service needs in rural areas.
